Pittsfield Needs Election Inspectors

What an Election Inspector Does

If you've ever wondered how to become more active in government, there are plenty of opportunities for you. During an election, each city and township requires a staff of paid workers to work at the polls.

Election Inspectors are paid to assist voters at the polls on Election Day. Registered voters interested in serving as election inspectors must submit an election inspector application to the clerk of the city or township where they wish to serve.

(An individual can serve as an election inspector in any city or township in the county where he or she resides.)

In addition to their name, address and date of birth, applicants must include their political party preference and qualifications to fill the position such as education or experience.

An Election Inspector must be a registered voter. They cannot be a challenger, candidate, member of a candidate's immediate family, or a member of the local Board of Canvassers. Anyone convicted of a felony or an elections crime may not serve.

Election Inspectors are paid \$10 per hour. Training is paid.

The Clerk's Office will be able to answer any questions about how to apply to become an Election Inspector.
